From Our Pastor ~ Rev. Andrew Lovíns

Remember the exhilarating moment your parents removed your training wheels? It was a symbol of freedom, a thrilling transition into a new stage of your life. But what if I told you grace isn't just for those wobbly beginner rides? Just as the sturdy frame supported your cycling adventures, grace is the constant companion, the unseen force propelling us forward throughout life's journey.

Often, we think of grace as a one-time event, a divine favor bestowed at the outset of our spiritual path. But in reality, God's grace is an ever-flowing river of love and strength, continuously refreshing our spirits at every stage. John Wesley beautifully described it as a house:

- The Porch: This represents prevenient grace, the gentle nudge towards God that awakens our hearts to his love.
- The Door: This signifies justifying grace, the transformative moment where we accept Christ and are forgiven.
- The Rooms: These symbolize sanctifying grace, the ongoing process of growth and transformation as we become more like Christ.

While some might linger on the porch, true spiritual growth involves moving through the door, embracing justification, and stepping into the living rooms of sanctification. Remember, every step of this journey is fueled by grace.

What makes grace so vital? Simply put, we are saved by grace alone. No amount of good works or effort can earn our salvation. It's God's love and sacrifice that bridge the gap between our imperfections and his perfect holiness.

Why do we need continual doses of grace? Because, like a balloon with tiny holes, we leak. Our good intentions fade, and doubts creep in. Grace, however, patches those holes, replenishes our spirit, and keeps us afloat.

So, my friends, embrace grace, not just as a starting point, but as the fuel for your entire journey. Remember, it's not about clinging to the porch; it's about stepping through the door, exploring the rooms, and allowing God's love to transform you into the person he created you to be.

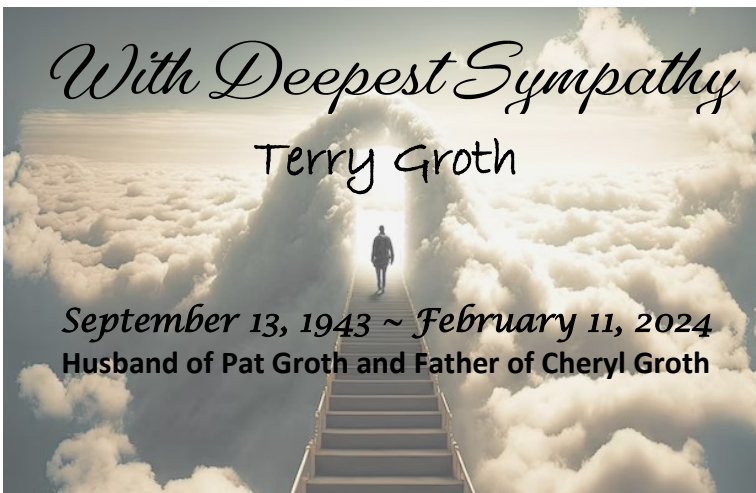
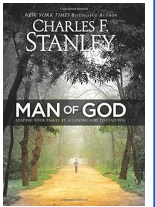


Non-Fiction: *ideals Easter* — Poems and short stories reflecting on the season of Easter. Filled with beautiful illustrations depicting Easter and Spring.



Christian Fiction: *The Next Person You Meet in Heaven* by Mitch Albom — THE NEXT PERSON YOU MEET IN HEAVEN is a sequel to *The Five People You Meet in Heaven*. When Annie was only eight-years-old she lost her left hand in a horrific accident at the Ruby Pier amusement park. The hand was surgically reattached but it left an indelible mark on Annie's life. She doesn't remember the tragic accident that killed Eddie, the amusement park mechanic but it left her scarred and the subject of ridicule. Annie struggles to find acceptance throughout her life, but feels as if everything she does is a mistake. When she reunites with Paulo, a childhood friend, she knows she has finally found happiness. They marry and this is where Annie's story begins. A romantic hot-air balloon ride the morning after the wedding ends in tragedy when Annie falls from the sky. She is whisked into her own heavenly journey, where she reunites with Eddie and learns how her life on earth affected others.

Religion/Spirituality: *Man of God* by Charles F. Stanley — **What does it take to be a "real" man?** You don't have to be perfect to be a man of God. As Dr. Charles Stanley writes, a man of God is a maturing man, a striving man, a knowledgeable man. And the first step in real manhood is spiritual rebirth. In *Man of God*, Dr. Stanley asks and answers questions such as these: What can we learn about manhood from Jesus's example? How does a true leader allow God to lead him? Why is a godly man "both velvet and steel"? What does it look like to be a provider? What does it mean to lead with sensitivity? *Man of God* will challenge and equip you to become a better leader, teacher, father, and husband. What makes a man? The answer starts here.

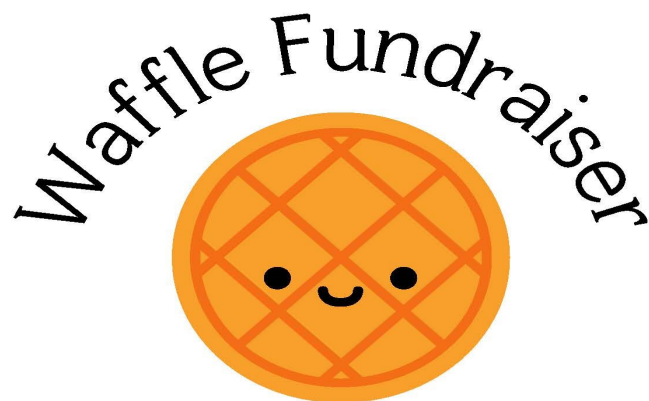

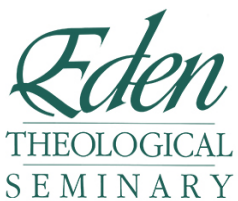
The Benevolence offerings that you mark on your envelopes each month are Second Mile offerings for special mission projects.
