Act Your Way Into Feeling: Small Changes, Big Impact

For as long as I can remember, the prevailing wisdom has been that change originates internally – that our beliefs shape our behavior. And while this holds true in many instances, it's not the universal key. Not everyone is primarily motivated by cognitive shifts. This explains why well-intentioned advice or fervent preaching often fails to resonate.

It's equally valid that motivation can stem from external factors. Sometimes, a new behavior paves the way for a new belief. Consider George. For a year, his routine after work was the same: returning to an empty house, plopping down in front of the television, and drinking. Over time, this habit morphed into alcoholism, a misguided attempt to alleviate his loneliness.

But then George initiated a subtle change. He moved his recliner to a different room, away from the television. The immediate effect was a reduction in his solitary drinking in front of the screen. As the cycle of excessive drinking and passive television watching lessened, George felt a shift. He decided to join a bowling league. Suddenly, his evenings were filled with activity outside the house, eliminating the environment that fueled his temptation to drink alone and dwell on his lack of companionship.

George still enjoys a beer, but it no longer controls his life or traps him in a cycle of lonely rumination. Sometimes, it's simply easier to act your way into a new way of feeling than to feel your way into a new way of acting.


Therefore, my suggestion is this: initiate a small change. Feeling stuck? Do something different. In my own life, when I notice my devotional practices waning, I introduce a change. Recently, purchasing a new translation of the New Testament reignited my habit of Bible reading.

As it says in Romans 12:2: "Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind." Sometimes, that renewing begins not with a thought, but with an action.

So, don't just wait passively for your feelings to shift. Experiment a little. Rearrange the furniture of your life. You might just discover that you don't need that next drink, or whatever your particular struggle may be.
